# Chrismas Party is on the 19th December

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### Mystacidium [Mycdm.] braybonae (syn. Mystacidium brayboniae)

Grown by Chris Dalrymple. This beautiful orchid is known only from the Soutspansberg Mountains in the Northern Province of South Africa. Interestingly, there are two races; the smaller being found in the Western parts of the region and the larger in the Eastern parts. They grow predominantly on the south facing slopes on Fig trees (Ficus sp.) where morning mists are prevalent. They grow best mounted in dappled light in intermediate conditions. In hot or dry weather they may have to be misted daily, even more than once if grown under artificial drying heat. (This plant was benched "not for judging" by choice of Chris not for other reasons, but the judges still considered it worthy of "Plant of the Evening".)



#### BENCHING PLANTS

When you arrive, you need to sign the Attendance Sheet and book your plants in at the door in the Plant Register Sheet. You need to write your name in the left column, record the total number of plants and then mark each class column in which you are entering plants, with the number benched.





For each plant's card you need to show the plant name, whether Open or Novice, the benching class and your name and place. Place the card next to the plant NOT UNDER THE POT, because freshly watered plants make the cards soggy and difficult to read. Please enter the names on the benching cards exactly as they are on the plant labels. If a label has a 'x' then put it on the benching card. If part of the name has inverted commas '.....' show them on the benching card. Always write capitals and other punctuation marks as well. If the plant name is unknown, Write "Unknown".

#### NOVEMBER MEMBERS' POPULAR CHOICE



Dendrobium mousmee, Grown by Warleiti Jap (Dendrobium amabile x Dendrobium thyrsiflorum)

This beautiful and popular hybrid was made and registered in 1941 by Maison Henri Vacherot-Lecoufle in France.

It grows readily in our part of Sydney in dappled to bright indirect light

in cool to intermediate conditions. Keep it moist when in active growth in spring and summer. Best results are said to come from plants that are grown in pots that appear too small for the pot size.

#### WINNING OPEN PLANTS BENCHED



Phalaenopsis Younghome Princess 'White Pearl' Phal. Leopard Prince x Phal. Fuller's E-Plus Grown by Warleiti Jap.

This hybrid was made and registered in 2012 by Young Home Orchids of Taiwan. What makes this unusual is not just the fact that it is an albanistic form of *Phal*. Younghome Princess but it is also peloric. In this case the labellum (a modified petal), has taken the shape and colouration of the two other petals. Most peloric Phalaenopsis retain the "horns" at the end of the labellum to some extent. In this case it has not, which has given it a much more rounded form. This is a plant with potential.

Buda Ivanisevic, you asked about your plant in the photo below: It is a Dendrobium fimbriatum found across the Himalayan countries to China and South East Asia. It grows cool in the Eastern Suburbs of Sydney. It likes dappled to indirect bright light.

I grow mine in a medium Bark with some Perlite. I fertilkise weekly weakly if I can remember.
