# Ctt. Portia vs Ctt. Molly Tylei



Cattlianthe Molly Tyler

At the meeting there was some discussion about a plant of Ctt. Molly Tyler and its resemblance to Ctt. Portia. I have been into Orchidwiz to examine the parentage of the two plants.

Portia is a primary hybrid of Guarianthe bowringiana x Cattleya labiata made in1897 by Veitch. Molly Tyler is a cross of 4 species, Guarianthe bowingiana, C purpurata, C dowiana and C percivilliana. It was made in 1900 by Mr and Mrs F Dixon.

Looking at the images for the two flowers, Portia 'Cannizaro' is a very pink hybrid whereas many of the other Portias shown are much paler. The Molly Tylers are more pinker to red than the Portias. The shapes of the two hybrids are very similar. Portia has far more awards than Molly Tyler and has 5-14 flowers/inflorescence. Molly Tyler awards show between 5-10 flowers/inflorescence.

Portia has had many offspring with 111 registered of whom 11 have been awarded. Molly Tyler has had only

one hybrid made, not awarded. The flowers are very similar and the confusion is easily explicable
