

# DON'T FORGET TO COLLECT YOUR GCP ORDER FROM ROGER

Benching Rule: In order to bench a plant for judging, you must have owned it for at least six months.

## **DEFLASKING ORCHIDS**

If you have the facilities to grow them, it is cost effective to buy flasks of orchid seedlings. So why not have a go at this interesting challenge? It's very hard to pollinate orchid flowers and collect their tiny seeds, so it is better to leave that to professional nurseries. The experts germinate the seeds under sterile laboratory conditions on specially formulated agar jelly inside sealed sterile bottles. Once the seedlings are well established, it is possible to buy flasks of them, and they are readily available at a number of Orchid Shows. You need to plan for enough space, as well as having the commitment to grow them for 3-5 years, before you will be rewarded with flowers. The excitement of waiting is one of the attractions.



Before deflasking. ensure the seedlings have developed good root systems. If not. leave them in the flask at 23°C and 15 hrs of light per day until they have grown. Do not open the flask until you are ready to deflask as fungi may enter. There is a small hole in the flask top that enables air to

exchange. On the other hand, do not leave plants in the flask too long, or they will become stressed due to lack of space, nutrition and incorrect pH as the nutrient jelly breaks down. Aim to create the same environment for the tiny seedlings that you would put similar mature plants into. Consider ways to slightly reduce the light compared to that used for mature plants, and protect from temperature extremes. This is only needed for a short time to enable the seedlings to acclimatise as quickly as possible.

The ideal time to deflask is mid-Autumn or early Spring, when plants are actively growing. When it is warm, they can be immediately transferred to a location alongside mature plants of the same group.

#### Method

- 1. Write identification labels for plants
- 2. Fill pots to within 30mm of the top with moistened fine pine bark, pressing down lightly.
- 3. Remove plants from the flask by unscrewing or unclipping the top and shaking out the plants. With glass flasks, wrap the flask in newspaper and gently break with a hammer.

- 4. Wash the agar jelly from the roots, being careful not to damage them. It is not necessary to wash all the agar from the roots, as small pieces will dehydrate and virtually disappear.
- 5. Plants can then be transferred into a fungicide solution. Separate the plants carefully.
- 6. Individually position the plants in pots. Add bark to top up the pot while positioning the plants with the base of the plant just below bark level. Firm down bark slightly. Insert identification labels.
- 7. Position the pot in a suitable location.
- 8. Maintain high humidity by frequent light misting.
- 9. Fertilise regularly with a weak solution. After about 3-4 weeks, you should begin to see some signs of growth as either new roots or leaves. Apply fungicide after 4-6 weeks.
- 10. After 18-26 weeks, when the plants have 'hardened' enough they can be planted into pots, and put back in a shady spot for a couple of weeks, before being treated as adult plants of the same species.
