Eastern Suburbs Orchid Society celebrates its 50th anniversary

EASTERN Suburbs Orchid Society celebrated its 50th anniversary with a commemorative luncheon with a backdrop of an excellent display of plants.

Commemorative plaques were presented to the patron, Ernie Page, life members and those who have worked hard over the years to keep the society moving ahead.

It was on May 15, 1950 that a small group of orchid devotees first met as an offshoot from the Orchid Society of New South Wales at St Stephens Church in Bellevue Hill. The inaugural office bearers were president Mr E. McDonald, vice president Dr C. Cramp, secretary Mr S. Russell and treasurer Mr A. Wallach.

Soon the membership outgrew St Stephens and the society moved to the Graham Memorial Church

Hall at Charing Cross followed by a move to Randwick Literary Institute. Membership took off again and ultimately the society moved to its current meeting venue at St. Luke's in Glovelly.

There have been many highlights over the years but few can top ESOS winning Affiliated Society Display at the World Orchid Conference in Sydney in 1969. As housing in the

eastern suburbs has changed, the society has seen a change in the plants on display with cymbidiums waning in favour of smaller compact and miniature plants. Natives are always popular.

The society's three "lifers" deserve special mention. Bob Cole, an inaugural member and treasurer for many years, still runs the point score competition and sporsors the novice prize, the Bob Cole Award. For 10 years he also ran and sponsored a handicap competition which was most successful.

Bob Collins will do anything for anyone and his recen: award of an OAM was thoroughly deserved. As secretary, then president he brought the society through a lean period and set it growing again. He continues to be very active in promoting the society whenever possible.

The society's resident expert, Norm Chaney, completes the trio. As well as an experienced grower of superb orchids, particularly his beloved slipper orchids, Norm is a fine teacher of the little extras that produce top quality show plants and gives freely of his great knowledge to everyone in the society.

The Eastern Suburbs Orchid Society's anniversary badge depicted Ptst. hians, the "Opera House" orchid. This is now thought to be extinct in the wild. A small number of these badges are still available from the secretary for \$5 (post and
